Attendance/Punctuality	
<ul> <li>✓ Arriving late to class</li> <li>✓ Unexcused absence</li> <li>✓ Returning late from class break</li> <li>✓ Leaving class early</li> </ul>	
Professional Etiquette	
<ul> <li>✓ Using electronic devices (e.g. phone, tablet, computer, etc.) during class for the purpose of accessing material unrelated to the course</li> <li>✓ Texting during class</li> <li>✓ Disruptive talking (e.g. side conversations)</li> <li>✓ Inappropriate non-verbal communication (e.g. eye-rolling, sighing, huffing, grimacing, etc.)</li> </ul>

<ul> <li>✓ Interrupting or talking over someone</li> <li>✓ Verbal outbursts and physical threats</li> <li>✓ Student does not respond to emails in a timely manner</li> <li>✓ Inappropriate written communication, (e.g. email)</li> <li>✓ Student does not maintain patient confidentiality in their clinical setting or while presenting patients to faculty or other students</li> </ul>
